

# **10 THINGS POPE FRANCIS** WANTS YOU TO REMEMBER IN THIS

- We often meet discouraged people who look to the future with skepticism and pessimism as if nothing could bring them happiness. May the Jubilee be an opportunity for everyone to rekindle hope!
- Christian hope does not deceive or disappoint, because it is founded on the certainty that nothing and no one can ever separate us from divine love.
- Rediscovering patience is good for ourselves and for others. Saint Paul often uses patience to emphasize the importance of perseverance and trust in what God promised us, but above all he testifies that God is patient with us: he is "the God of patience and comfort" (Rom 15:5)
- This Holy Year will guide the path towards another fundamental date for all Christians: in fact, 2033 the two thousandth anniversary of the Redemption will be celebrated, accomplished through the passion, death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus.
- Everyone, in reality, feels the need to recover the joy of living, because the human being, created in the image and likeness of God, cannot be content with surviving or living, nor conform to the present time, satisfying himself with only material realities.
- Christian hope consists precisely in this: in the face of death, when everything seems to end, through Christ and his grace communicated to us in Baptism, we receive the "life does not end, it is simply transformed" forever.
- 7. Everything that we now live in hope, we will then see in reality.
- 8. Forgiveness does not change the past; it cannot modify what has already happened; however, forgiveness can allow us to change the future and live differently without resentment, hatred, and revenge.
- 9. Hope finds its highest witness in the Mother of God. In her, hope is not a fleeting optimism but a gift of grace in the realism of life.
- 10. Let us allow ourselves, from now on, to be attracted by hope, allowing it to become contagious through us to those who desire it.

# National Visitation of the Relics of St. Jean de Brébeuf and of St. Kateri Tekakwitha

Please mark your calendar. On Sunday, January 19, 2025 at the Cathedral in Prince George, the major relics of the Canadian Martyrs will visit at the 11:00am Mass. After the Mass, there will be an opportunity for veneration of the relics.

The major relics of the Canadian Martyrs, including the skull of St. Jean de Brébeuf and bones of St. Charles Garnier and St. Gabriel Lalemant, will be travelling across Canada for the first time.

The relics have resided principally at the National Shrine to the Canadian Martyrs in Midland, Ontario for the past hundred years. The three Jesuit saints are among the eight French missionaries who first brought the Gospel to Canada and were martyred during the Huron-Iroquois Wars of the early 1600s. Joining them will be the relic of St. Kateri Tekakwitha, the first indigenous North American saint, who was canonized in 2012 and is a beloved patron of the First Nations peoples.
